MALT WHISKY

JURA 10YR

£4.75

The Isle of Jura is just east of Islay and Jura 10YR is the only malt distilled on the island and has been bottled there since 1810. It has fresh notes of damp hay and soft, malty cereal notes with a touch of peat with gentle oak and arak with blossom tones

TOBERMORY 10YR

£4.55

The distillery is located on the sheltered shore of the fast flowing Tobermory river on the Isle of Mull. A light bodied whisky with a dryish taste with nuts and apple brandy and a hint of smoke and cereal notes thrown in as well

ARDBEG

£5.35

Founded by MacDougall tenant farmers, first distilling this smoky whisky in 1790. It is said that the louvers in the kiln were manipulated so as to casue the smoke to linger and impart a high level of peatiness Peaty, medicinal, salty and dry, but, to taste is surprisingly sweet, followed by a hit of smoke

CAOL ILA

£5.35

This whisky (pronounced Cul-eela) got its name from the strait between Islay and Jura, is situated in a small bay near Port Askaig on Islay. A light fruity and sweet scent hits the nose, followed by smoked ham and seaweed with fragrant smoke and antiseptic taste

DALMORE

£5.15

Founded in 1839 'The Dalmore' distillery is located in Alness, which is 20 miles North of Inverness and sits on the banks of the Cromarty Firth overlooking the Black Isle. Roasted coffee beans, the oily nuttiness in a fine espresso, there are little notes of malt and cereal and butter with rich orange

MALT WHISKY

OLD PULTENEY 12 YEAR OLD

£4.25

Released to mark the 50th anniversary of repeal in Wick, Pulteney is the most nothern distillery on the mainland and used to be described as the Manzanilla of the North. Distinctly maritime with oily and light fresh fruit notes on the nose. Slightly salty with traces of nuts to taste

BALVENIE DOUBLE WOOD

£4.75

Balvenie, distilled on the Balvenie estate in Speyside, pride themselves on doing everything in-house, including growing their own barley and has its own floor maltings. Honeycomb, dried fruit and malt hit the nose first, followed by a sweet taste with slight drying and acidity

AUCHENTOSHAN 12 YEAR OLD

£5.25

The name Auchentoshan is from Gaelic 'Achadh an t-Oisein' which translates as "the field of the corner". The Distillery is West of Glasgow in Dalmuir and has been producing this fine malt since 1823. A little fruity yet it has some dry woodiness. A touch of smokiness with a little sweetness at the end

GLENKINCHIE

£5.75

Founded in 1837, the Glenkinchie distillery is found in Pencaitland, East Lothian and is one of the six distilleries in the Lowland region. Light, yet fragrant with notes of fresh cereal and some barley sweetness. There is a freshness and roundness to this dram. The finish is of medium length with notes of fresh greenness

MACALLAN 12 YEAR OLD

£4.25

The Macallan Distillery in Speyside has been in production since 1825 and uses "curiously small stills" and only the best oak casks for maturation. This complex whisky has hints of fruit and heather honey and is soft and malty on the palate with lingering hints of oak and fruit
